FRESHWATER SLSC OPEN CARNIVAL

The 2025 Freshwater Australia Day Open Carnival was held on Sunday 19th January – it was once again publicised as being part of "Perfect Australia Day Weekend" of surf events along with Manly LSC. Again attempting to increase the profile of this surf lifesaving weekend on the Northern Beaches against competition from Queensland club events.

Unfortunately the surf conditions that had been forecast all week to make conditions for the event tricky and unlikely eventuated – the decision was made 24 hours in advance to relocate the Freshwater Carnival to Manly beach – renamed for the day as "South Freshwater". It wasn't an easy decision to make by those involved but the important factor was that the event was held for the many competitors who had travelled from inter-state and elsewhere in NSW. This decision was very much appreciated by the competitors. The weather for the day was about perfect, however surf and swell conditions required regular monitoring to ensure events could be run safely. Three(3) Water Areas were "set up" for the commencement of the day with a 7.30am start being achieved and the last Water areas closing around 3.30pm. The conditions were "classic" for the events, the best seen for many years and relished (maybe apprehensively) by the competitors. A big "shout out" to the IRB and jetski personnel who well and truly deserved our thanks for the day.

Entry numbers were around 700 competitors, about the same as the 2024 carnival.

This year saw the continuation of the extended focus on Board events as part of the "Tim Kirkby Memorial Races" which continues to promote greater interest in the Freshwater event. Prize winners for the events came from Burleigh Heads/Mowbray Park and Northcliffe for example and the winner of the Open Female Board, Georgia Singleton, was an ex Freshwater U6 nipper !

The water conditions were relatively flat but the positioning of the "flagged area" for the public lead to a few decisions being made on the start and finish line to suit the small rip in the course itself. The course ended up varying from the traditional course and was more an "out and back" down the northern end of the beach.


